# Suicide, Violence, Mental Illness and Addiction

October 21, 2020 | 9:00 AM – 4:30 PM | CE 12-14



## WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Social Workers, Professional Counselors, Psychologists, Addictions Counselors and any other interested Human Service professionals.

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This training alerts professionals to the connection between violence, suicide, mental illness, and/or addiction. You will be given information on spotting and preventing violence and suicide among consumers coping with co-occurring disorders. The cycles of violence and suicide attempts will be discussed with an eye on how to intervene at each stage. Participants will be asked to take a developmental approach. We will consider the current data identifying high-risk populations. Assessment tools and the importance of identifying protective factors will be stressed.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Cite current data on at risk populations, e.g. first responders, LGBTQ youth, etc.
2. Incorporate protective factors into treatment strategies.
3. Assess suicidality and potential for violence using clinical interviews and assessment tools.
4. Describe how mental illness and substance abuse in combination contribute to suicidality and potential for violence.
5. Plan suicide prevention strategies for people coping with mental illness, SUDs, and other issues in combination.
6. Process suicide and attempted suicide with family members and significant others.
7. Evaluate the safety of their worksite.

## Directions to Allegany College of Maryland

**From the Washington/Baltimore areas**, take I-70 or I-270 to Frederick and go west past Hagerstown and Hancock. Just west of Hancock, take I-68 west to Cumberland and proceed about 35 miles to exit 44, Willowbrook Road. Turn left at the bottom of the ramp and go about one mile to Allegany College of Maryland on the left. The class will be held in the Continuing Education Building, the first on the right. Please allow 2 1/2 – 3 hours travel time.

**From the west**, take I-68 east toward Cumberland. Take exit 44, Willowbrook Road and go right at the bottom of the ramp. Travel one mile to the campus and follow Washington/Baltimore directions to the class.
